Report on visit to Toronto June 2016

In all honesty, I had never heard of the Travelling Surgeons Society (TSS) prior to the day I saw the Price-Thomas Fellowship advertised in the Royal College of Surgeons newsletter that appeared in my inbox. It intrigued me, and after a quick Google, I decided to apply for the Fellowship. It was a chance to visit Toronto, to which I had never been before, and as well as gaining a privileged insight into a foreign healthcare system, there was the opportunity to travel with my wife, Rachael. Although both of a medical background, we had never before travelled together to a medical meeting or conference. The prospect of an overseas trip with people that I had never met was an unknown quantity. Professor Brian Ellis, TSS Honorary Secretary, was extraordinarily welcoming with his email communication, and the real hard work of organizing the trip had already been done. The excellent organization allowed me to visit many of the places that I may not have seen if visiting Toronto as a holiday-maker. The academic meetings were eye-opening, and the local host, Professor Jim Rutka could not have been more gracious. We had unprecedented access to the Canadian healthcare system, and saw local "trainee" presentations of International quality. We were wined and dined at the highest level (at the top of the CN Tower!), the guided tours were excellent, and the provision of free-time was perfect to allow myself and Rachael to enjoy a holiday.
